The film will not only follow Sirianni’s journey in pursuit of her dream, but will also share the perspectives of leaders, celebrities and everyday people as they discuss their belief systems, attitudes and the actions they have taken in pursuit of their own dreams. “My Wish” poses such thought provoking questions as:

- How can you make the process of “manifesting a dream” a realistic possibility while contending with the many demands of day-to-day life?
